- 3. Tech Committee Update-Working on establishing the Phase II of our technology plan to present to the Board in the spring,
- 4. Joint School Boards meeting Save the Date-District 34 will be hosting on January 28, 2013 in the Winfield Central Commons.
- 5. Nursing Substitutes-Looking into different options to finding substitute nurses. Cadence Health has generously offered an additional contribution to fund the cost. The cost based on Kris Monzel's estimated number of annual absences.
- 6. SASED Update-Given that Dr. Lehman is no longer present in his District, Dr. Kell has been appointed to take over as Vice-President of the SASED Board.

#### From the Principal-

- New ISAT Cut Scores and transition to Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers-Assessment (PARCC)-Mrs. Reinke reviewed the new assessment that will be replacing ISAT in 2014-15 school year since ISAT doesn't align with new Common Core state standards.
- 2. Performance Evaluation Advisory Council (PEAC) School Climate Survey (spring 2013) grs. 6-12-Now required by the state as part of the school report card on the Illinois Interactive Report card IIRC website for grades 6-12 beginning with October 2013 reporting.

#### From the Board President-

**Triple I Conference-** Susan Gillespie and Bob Brown reported on the presentations that they attended at the conference. Susan Gillespie and representatives from the 3 feeder districts boards presented on the topic of collaboration vs. consolidation. As a result of her attending a meeting at the Winfield Creek stakeholder group, Eric Spande (village trustee) volunteered to present to our 8<sup>th</sup> grade science classes on water.

#### From the Director of Business Services-

- The Board voted to approve the 2012 Tax Levy.
- Health Plan Annual Renewal- Mr. Gallois reviewed the cost of health care and the fact that it went up 16% this
  year. He is seeking additional information from Blue Cross Blue Shield as to the reason for the increase. He
  expressed his concern for the lack of predictability of the cost for future budget estimation.
- Approval of Resolution Supporting Governmental Self Insurance Pooling and In Opposition To Non-Productive Legislation Restraints.
