As a result, our responsibility as a school district is to ensure that our students and staff feel safe in our school environment. To that end we are constantly reviewing and revising policies and procedures. Some of this work can be categorized as routine for we review policies throughout the school year. But in addition to our typical policy review cycle we have been called upon to scrutinize even further our day to day operations. While we pride ourselves on being known as a welcoming district to all visitors we know that we must be more vigilant enforcing those procedures to ensure necessary safeguards are in place for those "worst case" scenarios. Many thanks is extended to our community and families for your understanding and patience as we adopt and implement some of those security measures that we know will instill that sense of security for all who visit

Over the summer we will be erecting a fence/gate along the Beecher Street Primary School playground perimeter. In an effort to minimize the exposure that our students have

on a daily basis to the pedestrian traffic along Beecher Street and to provide a protective barrier for the many balls that roll into the street. We feel that this fence will provide another layer of security for our students. No visitors will have access to the

playground during school hours and all visitors will sign in at one of our school offices. It is a simple solution as a result of receiving funding for the fence through the 2013 Community Chest Grant awarded to us from Cadence Health.

Finally, as a district we have many safeguards in place to monitor the content of what our children are exposed to via the internet in school. However, it is during unsupervised time outside of school that most children engage in inappropriate behavior via the internet. Parents, please partner with us by monitoring your child's internet usage by putting controls in place while children are at home. Please review and use the internet safety resources on page 4 of this newsletter. Make sure you have your children's passwords as it is a privilege, not a right to use the internet. Navigate the internet with them; monitor their conversations on social media sites not only with their friends that you know but most importantly those "friends" that you have never met. As a district we are committed to teaching our students to practice good cyber citizenship but we cannot do it alone.

Since our staff will be growing next year with the addition of the two special education cooperative classrooms, the SASED staff will be parking in the first 15 spots in the Lion's Park lot at the end of the block on Beecher Street.

his should alleviate any potential congestion. We are also rearranging the restricted parking spots in front of the Primary School. There will only be two Reserved Parking spots for the Administration for easy access throughout the day. All other spots will now be open for either visitors or staff. You will not be able to line up for preschool pick-up until all buses have exited our parking lot after 3 p.m. If you are picking up or dropping off your children for preschool by the Primary gym, we continue to ask that you remain in your car in the line and do not park in any of the parking spaces unless you are coming inside for business.
